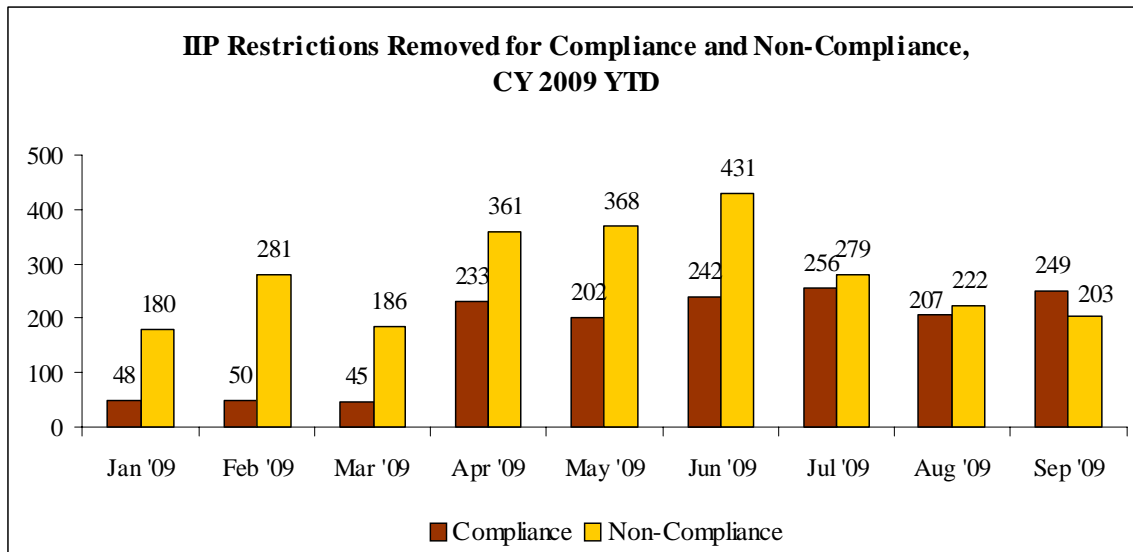

Following is a summary of issues discussed at the MDOT-MVA Stat on November 13, 2009. Analysis is provided by StateStat and the Governor's Delivery Unit (GDU).

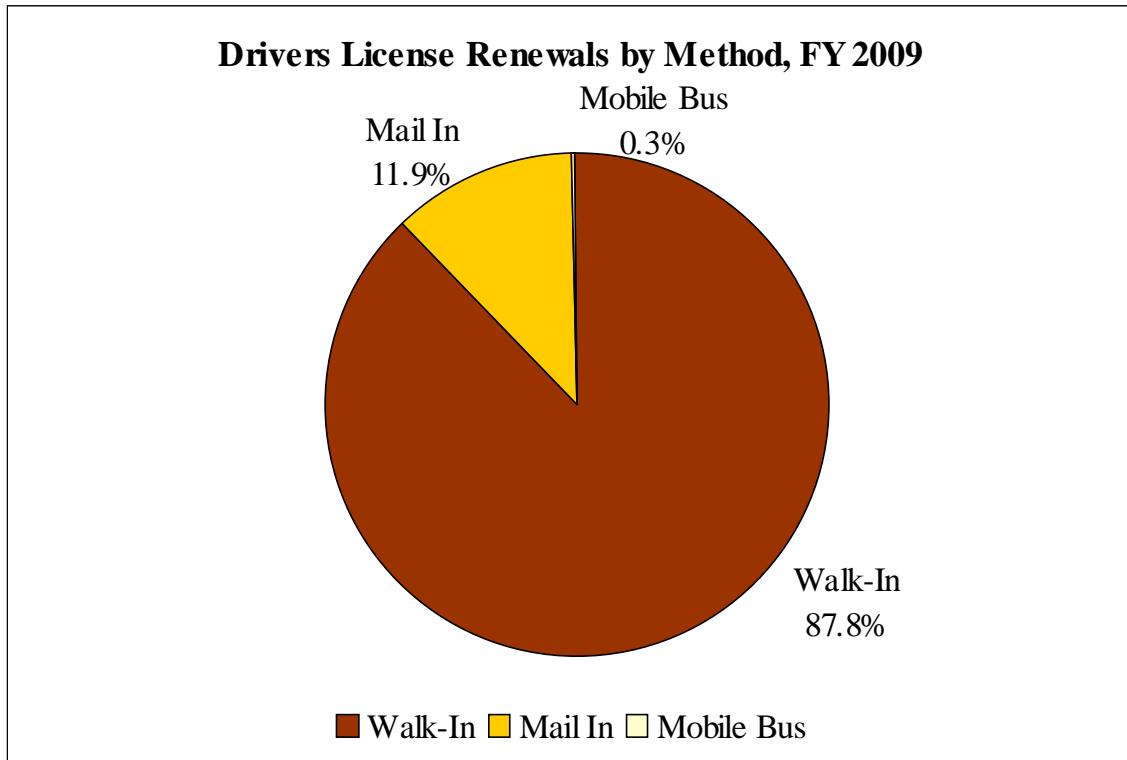
General Discussion

- **Ignition Interlock Program (IIP).** The StateStat panel regularly reviews the status of the Ignition Interlock Program. Participants in the program are given devices which check blood alcohol levels via breath test; if the test is over the legal limit, the device prevents the car from starting.
- The following chart shows the number of participants whose restrictions were removed, either for successful completion of the program or for too many violations. Those with too many violations who are in the program through court order are returned to the court for failing to meet the terms of sentencing.

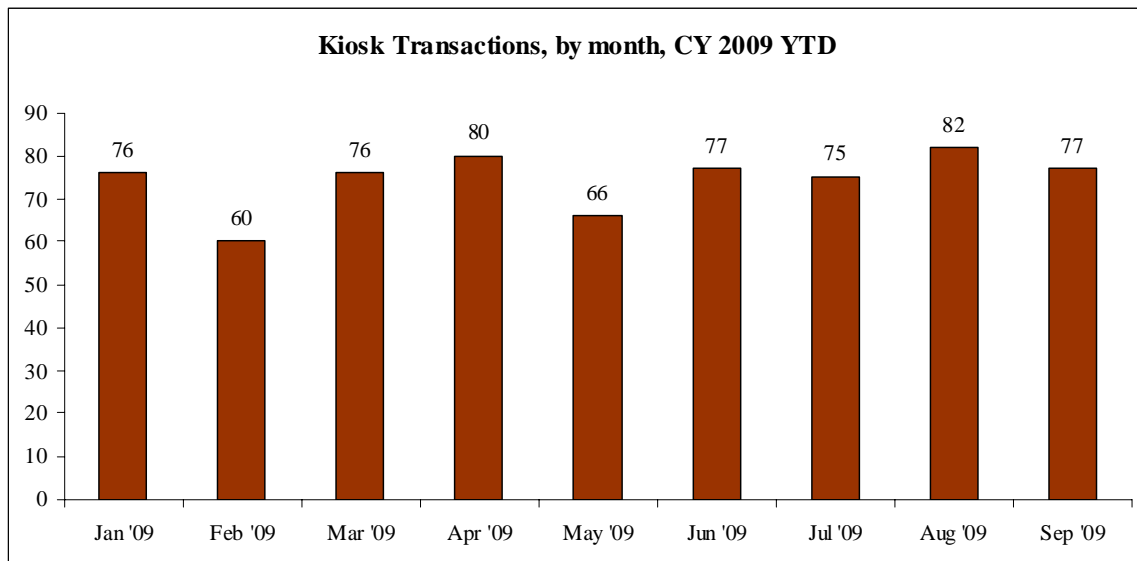


- September marks the first time compliance removals have been higher than non-compliance removals. The Department and panel discussed what factors are leading to increased successful completions; one factor is increased oversight due to automating warnings from the device.
- In addition, the panel and Department discussed how court orders are enforced for other prohibitions, such as IIP participants who also participate in the Drunk Driving Monitoring Program (DDMP), which is run by the Division of Parole and Probation (DPP).

- Alternative Service Delivery.** At the paenl’s request, the Department provided data regarding how most clients renew their driver’s licenses. The following chart shows drivers’ license renewals by type for FY 2009:



- The Department also commented on its efforts to provide increased alternative service delivery for driver’s license and other transactions. One effort is to increase kiosk transactions. The following chart shows the number of kiosk transactions over the last month:



- Although kiosk transactions have remained relatively low, the Department noted efforts to increase usage by upgrading systems and providing more advertising. This issue will be explored further in future Stat meetings.
