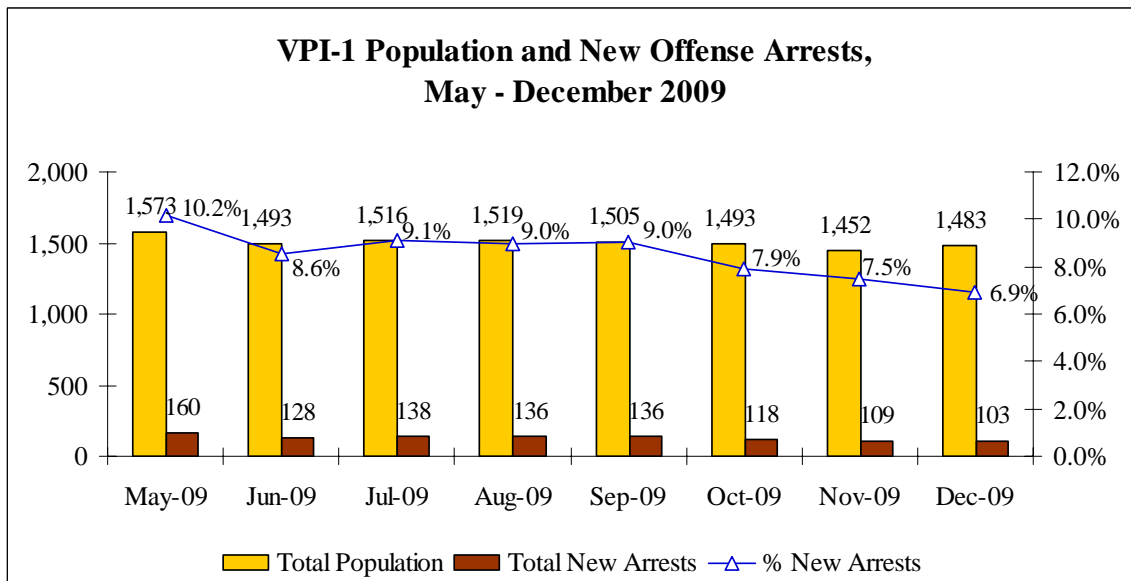

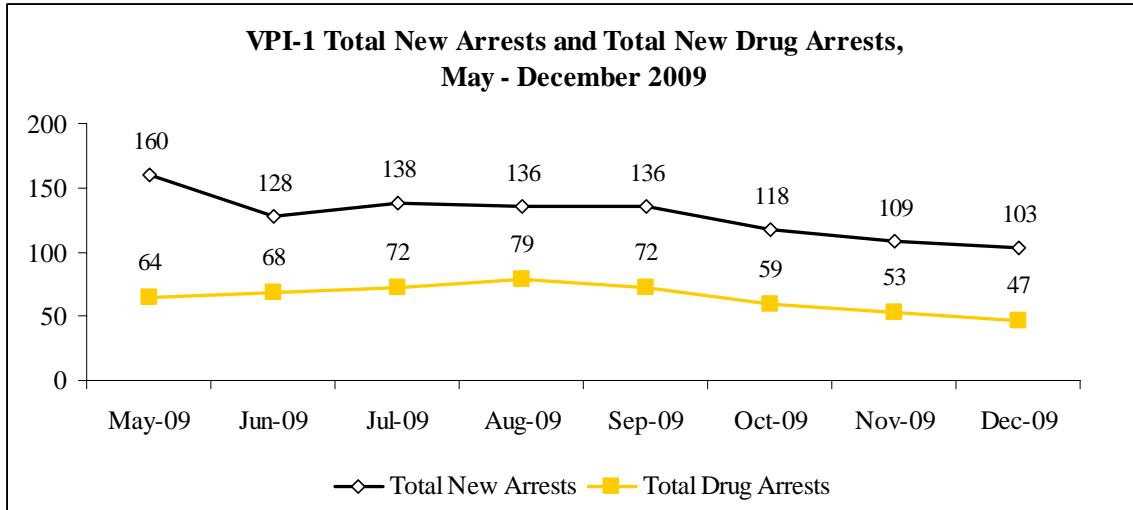
Following is a summary of issues discussed at the DPSCS—DPP/DPDS Stat on January 21, 2010. Analysis is provided by StateStat and the Governor’s Delivery Unit (GDU).

General Discussion

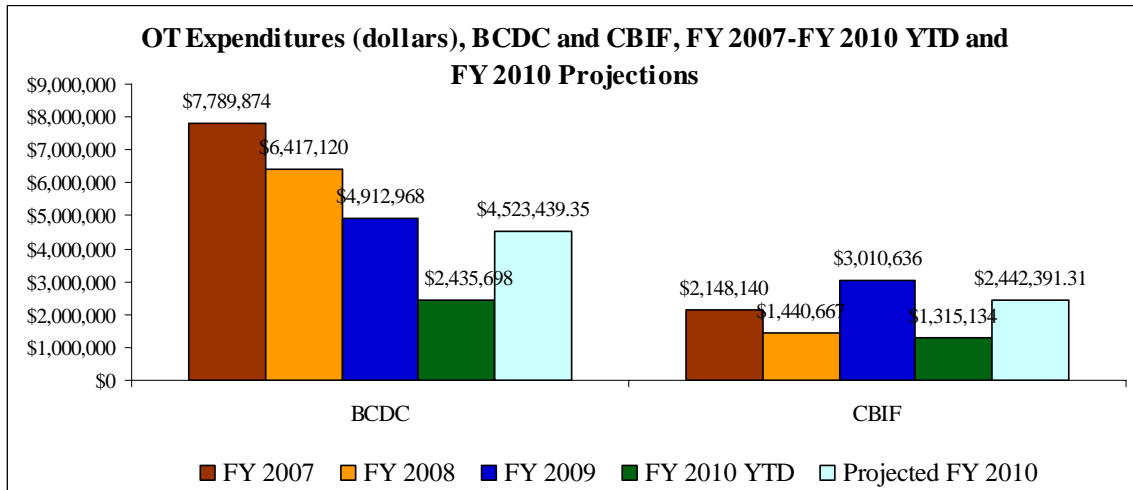
- **Warrants.** The Department and StateStat discussed the new warrant template, which now has two months of data. The discussion centered on warrant production and service, and on potential strategies to better identify high priority warrants and serve them.
- **VPI Supervisee Recidivism.** Overall, the number of new offense arrests for VPI-1 supervisees has declined in the last four months, as seen in the following chart:



- The Department noted that one cause is that fewer arrests were made in Baltimore City over the same period, which would subsequently drive down the number of VPI-1 arrests; StateStat will pursue further analysis to determine the extent of this factor on the overall decline.
- Furthermore, the number of drug arrests has been a factor in the declining number of arrests, as seen in the following chart:



- In addition, the Department and StateStat reviewed two DPP VPI cases to determine if supervision policies were followed and identify any potential areas of concern.
- **Overtime.** A key focus of recent StateStat sessions has been overtime expenditures at the Division of Pre-Trial Detention Services. The following chart indicates that both DPDS facilities are on track to achieve a reduction in overtime when compared with last year:



- Furthermore, StateStat and the Department regularly review overtime by pay period to determine if further savings can be achieved. The following chart shows overtime expenditures by pay period at both BCDC and CBIF:
