<b>Mandatory Release (MAN):</b> A non-discretionary release from prison required by law after a criminal offender has served his or her sentence, less diminution of confinement credits.
<b>Parole (PAR):</b> A discretionary, conditional release from criminal imprisonment granted by the Maryland Parole Commission.
<b>Probation (PRO):</b> A disposition under which a court defers imposition of a sentence or suspends the sentence and releases an individual under prescribed terms and rules for a specified period of time.
<b>Probation Before Judgment (PBJ):</b> A disposition under which a court defers imposition of a verdict but may require compliance with prescribed rules and terms for a specified period of time.
<b><u>SUPERVISION LEVEL:</u></b>
<b>Violence Prevention Initiative (VP1 and VP2):</b> A supervision level for cases assigned to the Violence Prevention Initiative (VPI). VPI represents a strategy for the management of offenders who have been convicted of specified violent offenses and who, on the basis of a screening process, exhibit traits which have been linked through research to an increased potential for violent recidivism. Such individuals are diverted to a containment-based, intensive supervision strategy structured to minimize the threat they might otherwise represent to the community. This strategy involves the close monitoring and strict enforcement of an individual's compliance with all conditions of supervision, and immediate and decisive action in response to any instances of deliberate non-compliance. On 3/24/2009, DPP began stepping down VP1 offenders to VP2 and April 2009 was the first full month that VP2 data was available to report.
<b>High (HGH):</b> A supervision level to which cases with a risk assessment score of fifteen or above are assigned. At this level, a significant number of risk factors for recidivism are present which generally require substantial agent activity in the form of informational and motivational interviewing, initiation and monitoring of referrals, and response to non-compliant behavior – specifically through a graduated sanctioning process that leads to greater compliance and more successful outcomes.
<b>Moderate (MOD):</b> A supervision level to which cases with a risk assessment score above six and below fifteen are assigned. They are either offenders whose initial assessment indicated a lower level of risk to the community, or those whose performance at reassessment reflected successful efforts to address criminogenic factors, thus reducing the risk of recidivism. A change in classification from intensive to intermediate only occurs when it is agreed that the offender's adjustment to supervision merits the change, and that community safety is unlikely to be compromised by the change.
<b>Review (REV):</b> A supervision level to which all probation, parole, and mandatory release cases are initially assigned. A case may remain at this level for a maximum of sixty days, during which time essential records are gathered and reviewed, and a risk level is determined.
<b>Low Moderate (LMD):</b> A supervision level to which cases with a risk assessment score of six or lower are assigned. They are, for the most part, low-risk, low-impact, relatively stable offenders requiring minimal intervention on the part of an agent. For an offender classified as standard, an agent must ensure that the offender is instructed to complete all special conditions, to make all court-ordered payments as required, and to inform the agent immediately if he or she intends to change his or her residence or telephone number, or wishes to travel or relocate to another state.
<b><u>CASELOAD TYPE:</u></b>
<b>Drug Court:</b> Drug Treatment Court provides District and Circuit Court judges in Baltimore City with a sentencing option other than incarceration for non-violent, substance-abusing offenders with a history of drug-related criminal episodes. The program is designed to intervene in the criminal lifestyle of participants, with a goal of interrupting the repetitive cycle of arrest-incarceration-release-re-arrest characteristic of these offenders. The approach involves a specialized, treatment-focused form of intensive probation supervision that can involve such modalities as inpatient therapy, intensive outpatient therapy, mandatory urinalysis, acupuncture, education, transitional housing, and "shock" incarceration. Offenders assigned to Drug Court remain in either Intensive or Intermediate level of supervision.
<b>Sex Offender:</b> An individual against whom an incident of sexual misbehavior or criminal behavior with sexual intent has been charged, which has resulted in some form of criminal justice intervention or sanction. For purposes of specialized, containment-model supervision, the Maryland Division of Parole and Probation classifies as sexual offenders individuals under current supervision for a sexual offense, individuals under supervision for a non-sexual offense who are required to register as a sexual offender as a result of a prior offense, and individuals identified during the course of supervision as appropriate for specialized management. Risk assessments are conducted on these offenders using specialized instruments, on the basis of which they are assigned to one of four supervision levels (LV1 through LV4).
<b><u>KIOSK:</u></b>
A project designed to allow low-risk, non-violent offenders to use a kiosk – similar to an ATM machine – as their primary means of contact with a DPP agent. The supervision of lower-risk offenders through automated, less labor-intensive methods enables DPP to focus its resources more intensely on higher-risk offenders. Kiosks are now in operation in Baltimore City, Anne Arundel and Prince George's counties. Offenders assigned to KIOSK reporting may remain in any of the supervision levels.

### PRSP Template Definitions

Total Cases Under Supervision -- This is the total number of defendants who are being actively supervised by Agents of the Pretrial Release Services Program. All defendants who are under supervision have been ordered there by a judicial officer. (Total Cases Under Supervision is the sum of Total Priority Cases and Total General Cases.)

Total Cases Opened -- This number is the total number of defendants who, as a result of judicial order, have been placed under the supervision of PRSP in a given month.

Total Cases Closed -- This number is the total number of defendants who are no longer under the supervision of PRSP.

Total Priority Cases -- This is the total number of defendants who have been assigned the supervision level of "Priority". Priority cases are defendants who are in, or have been in, the VPI (no matter the charge), defendants who are charged with a handgun offense, domestic violence, or any high profile case.

VPI Cases -- This is a subset of the Priority cases and indicates the total number of defendants who are in, or have been in, the VPI.

Handgun Cases -- This is a subset of the Priority cases and indicates the total number of defendants who are charged with a handgun offense.

High Profile Cases -- This is a subset of the Priority cases and indicates the total number of "high profile" defendants under supervision. These cases are those that have usually made the news or the defendant is a public figure.

Noncompliant Cases -- This is the number of defendants under priority supervision who are non-compliant with conditions of release.

Failure to Appear in Court -- This is the number of defendants under priority supervision who failed to appear at a court hearing.

Contacts -- This is the total number of times the Pretrial Case Agents have made positive contact with a priority defendant.

Arrested on Warrants at Pretrial Offices -- This is the total number of priority defendants who were arrested at Pretrial Offices. These arrests are usually made by the Baltimore City Sheriff's Offices at the request of Pretrial Staff.

Average Cases per Agent -- This is the average caseload for the Agents who handle VPI, handgun, or domestic violence cases.

Total General Cases -- This is the total number of defendants under active supervision who do not fall under the Priority Caseload.

Noncompliant cases -- This is the total number of general defendants who are non-compliant with conditions of release.

Failure to Appear in Court -- This is the number of general defendants who failed to appear at a scheduled court hearing.

Contacts -- This is the total number of times the Pretrial Case Agent made positive contact with a general defendant.

Arrested on Warrants at Pretrial Offices -- This is the total number of general defendants who were arrested in pretrial offices on outstanding warrants.

Average Cases per Agent -- This is the average caseload of those Agents who do not carry VPI, handgun, or domestic violence cases.

### Dual Supervision

DPP Dual Supervision -- Total number of defendants that are being supervised by both the Division of Parole and Probation and the Pretrial Release Services Program.

DJS Dual Supervision -- Total number of defendants that are being supervised by both the Department of Juvenile Services and the Pretrial Release Services Program.

VPI Cases Transferred to DPP -- Total number of defendants that are transferred from dual supervision with DPP and PRSP to exclusive supervision by DPP. This must be accomplished by Judicial Order.
