

Meeting Summary

Following is a summary of issues discussed at the MSP Stat on March 8, 2011. Analysis is provided by StateStat and the Governor's Delivery Unit (GDU).

Follow Up

- **GDU Dashboard Delivery Plans.** On February 23rd, GDU, StateStat, GOCCP, and MSP had a very successful meeting discussing outdated measures and targets from the GDU Violent Crime/ Violent Crime Women and Children dashboards and Delivery Plans. The Department is currently working to address the extensive follow-up from the meeting and a new GDU dashboard should be in place by the next MSP stat. Until then, reporting will continue based on the old dashboards.
- **Prince George's County Homicides.** In reference to the multiple homicides in Prince George's County in January of this year, MSP was asked to discuss action steps that were taken by MSP? Also, an MOU was discussed at the last Stat meeting and MSP provided an update on the MOU.

MSP stated that they deployed additional resources in many areas of Prince George's County and they will continue to do so at the county's request. MSP will provide more detailed analysis of their resource deployment at the next Stat.

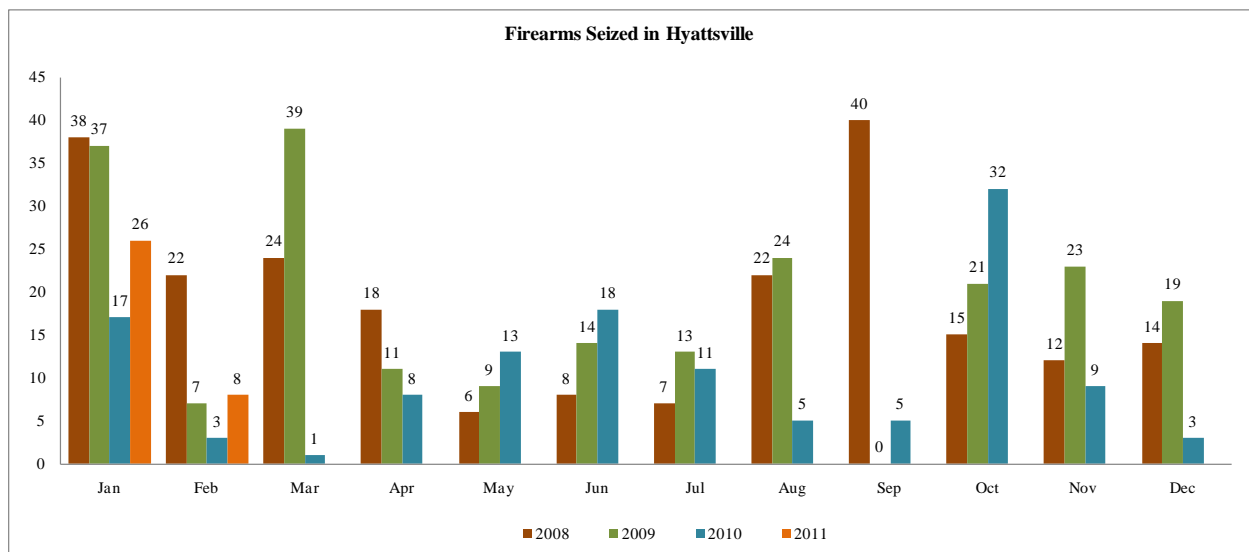
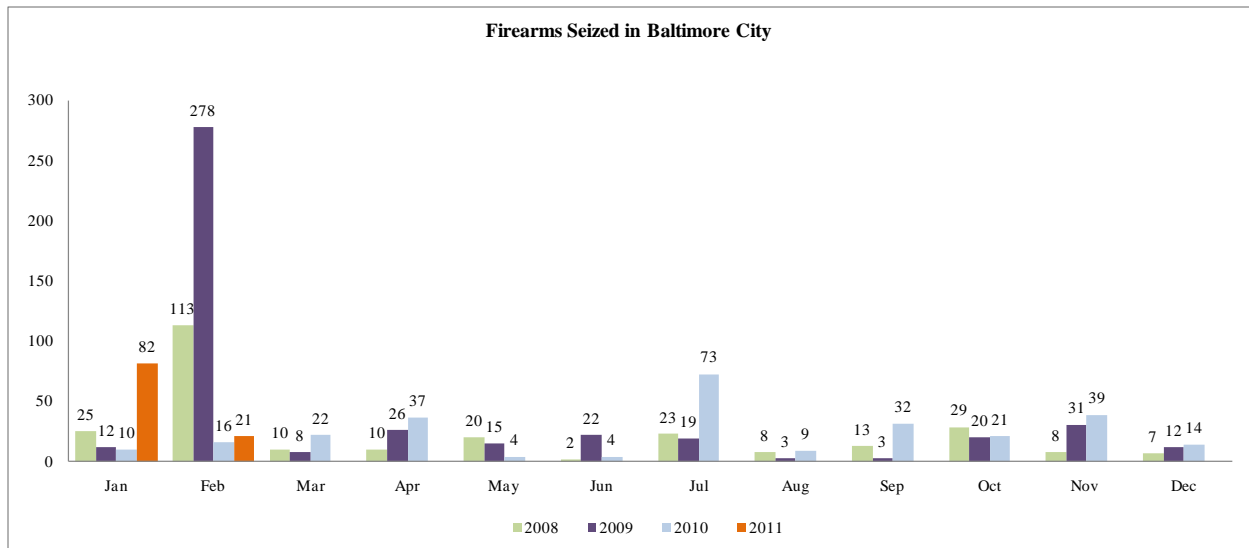
- **Gang Elimination Task Force.** MSP was asked in the follow-up from the previous meeting to provide an implementation timeline. MSP stated a timeline has been created but they will submit it once it has been finalized. The timeline will also discuss strategies as well as the names of the other states that will participate.

Guns

- **Firearm Task Forces** (GDU Goal Item IV). The following charts show monthly gun seizure efforts by the Baltimore and Hyattsville Firearm Task Forces, and the total amount of firearms seized, as well as search warrants and arrests from 2008 through February of 2011.

MSP has stated in their follow-up that they are continuing to develop a new firearms enforcement strategy. MSP continues to reiterate that the downward trend in 2010 for gun seizures is more a result of different reporting standards and a change in task force makeup (local vs. ATF), and not due to a reduction in work by MSP personnel.

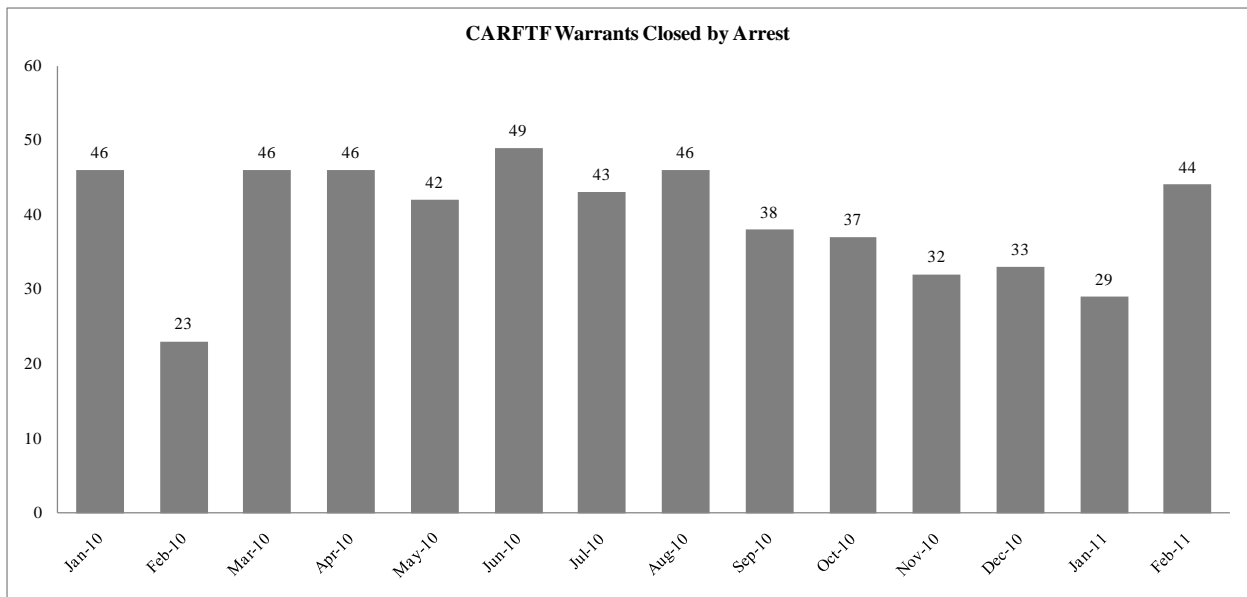

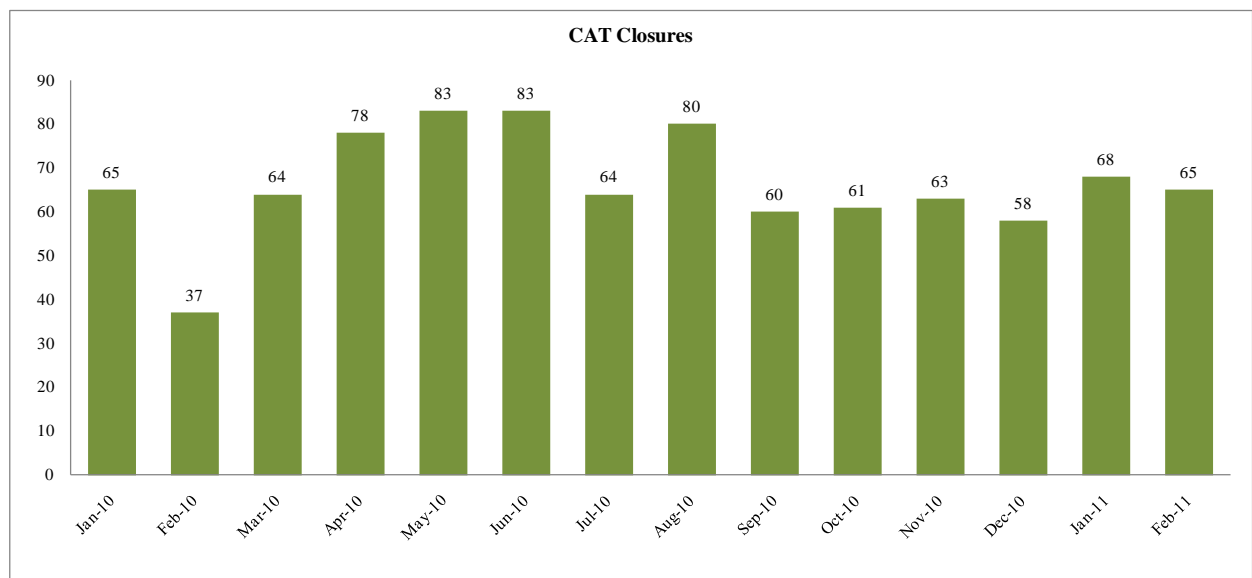

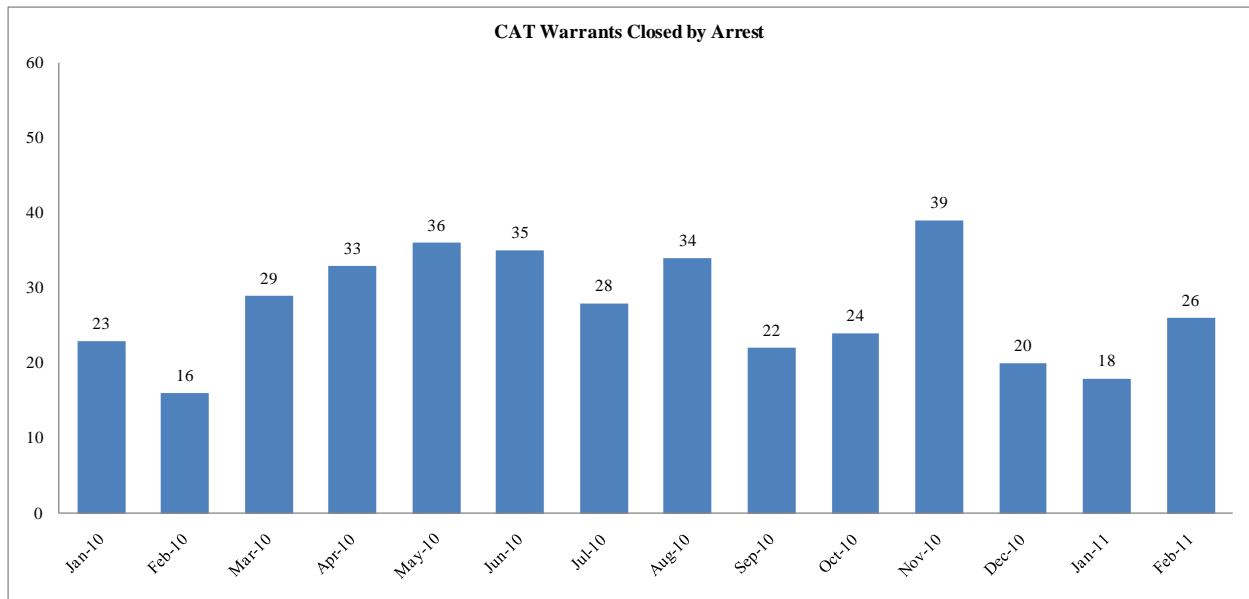
