

## Meeting Summary

Following is a summary of issues discussed at the MSP Stat on October 18, 2011. Analysis is provided by StateStat and the Governor's Delivery Unit (GDU).

### Follow Up

- **Gang Elimination Task Force.** In reference to the Gang Elimination Task Force, MSP was asked, as a follow-up item, to provide an update on the states/jurisdictions that have replied back to MSP in terms of their cooperation in the task force. John Draa provided to StateStat Director Beth Blauer correspondence indicating that MSP is now requesting that all remaining monies for the first year be redirected to the purchasing of License Plate Reader (LPR) technology, Mobile Data Terminals (MDT), Data Center Hardware, Cell Phone Tracking Technology, and "Livescan" Fingerprinting Technology. MSP has also requested a six month extension of the first year monies to guard against delays in the procurement process.
- **Homicide Updates.** The data below indicates that through October 18th of this year, there has been a 26 percent increase in homicides in Baltimore County and a 6 percent increase in Prince George's County, in comparison to the previous year. At the July MSP Stat, MSP mentioned that they have increased their presence in Prince George's County whereas they had targeted five "hot spots" where they will assist through September. MSP's provided an update on what the Field Operations Bureau has been doing the following to address increases in violent crime in Prince George's County
